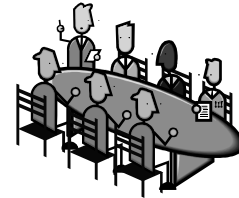

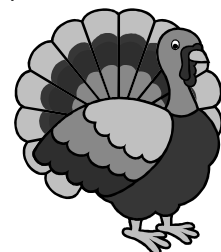

Pam - thanks for your diligent work in producing the alumni newsletter. I always enjoy reading it. Based on my roles as appraiser with the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation (the group that accredits approvers and providers of continuing nursing education nationwide), member and former chair of the Ohio Nurses Association's Continuing Education Approver Committee, owner of a continuing nursing education provider company, former member of the Continuing Education Advisory Group of the Ohio Board of Nursing, and frequent presenter of continuing nursing education sessions on Ohio nursing law and rules (whew!) I feel compelled to note that whenever an organization is granting continuing nursing education credit for an educational activity, nursing (nationally, not just in Ohio) uses the contact hour as our measure of achievement. There is a very substantial difference between contact hours and "CEU's"; and it is important that prospective learners know that they will be earning contact hours. The September 2004, newsletter item about nursing grand rounds states that "CEU's" are available. I'm assuming the reference is to contact hours awarded by Riverside's approved provider unit for nursing participants in these events. It would be very beneficial for alumni to know they are earning contact hours, the credits required for relicensure. Thanks for making note of this.

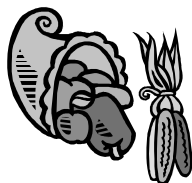

## CADET CORPS SEEKS CONGRESSIONAL RECOGNITION

Members of the Cadet Nurse Corps of World War II are looking for recognition—almost 60 years after the fact.

If Ruth Sartori, EdM, RN, CSN, and her colleagues have their way, a bill before Congress will become law and extend veterans' benefits to thousands of women who served stateside in the Cadet Nurse Corps during World War II. More important, Sartori says, the law would honor those who served but who received no official recognition.

## THE THOMPSON SOCIETY

The Thompson Society is named for Helen Alice Thompson, a woman of great vision who was years ahead of her time. Her name is one the OhioHealth Foundation uses with a great deal of respect, yet she is a woman about whom we know very little. She was the widow of Frank Thompson, In 1942, she left her estate of \$200,000 to White Cross Hospital.

Mrs. Thompson's will stated that a fund be established "exclusively for the use of the poor and the principal was to be "continuously maintained" for that purpose. It is because of her careful planning, her vision and courage to create something unseen, and her great generosity that the OhioHealth Foundation has *The Charity Care Endowment Fund* at Grant Medical Center and Riverside Methodist Hospital. The Charity Care Fund provides compassionate care without compromise for those in need, including prescriptions, clothing, transportation, oxygen and home care for indigent patients.

The OhioHealth Foundation now spends an average of \$225,000 each year on charity care from Mrs. Thompson's gift. Even with these annual expenditures, Mrs. Thompson's gift is now worth more than \$4.8 million. Her legacy has made a difference in the lives of thousands of people.

The Helen Alice Thompson Society was created in 1991 to honor Mrs. Thompson, as well as each of our special friends of the Foundation who have made planned gifts to Grant, Riverside and now Doctors Hospital. Each spring, the OhioHealth Foundation celebrates Mrs. Thompson's legacy and the vision of those who have included one of the hospitals in their estate plans, with an annual dinner for Thompson Society members. "We want to let the world know that we were contributing to our country in World War II," says Sartori, 78, a retired school nurse who helps coordinate the movement. "During the war, there was a critical shortage of nursing—even worse than now."

The Cadet Nurse Corps was created in 1943 to fill the gap left by experienced nurses recruited for overseas service. Nearly 124,000 young women signed up for the scholarship program and served for the remainder of the war in hospitals nationwide. "Many girls entered the corps and, without them, these hospitals would have shut down," Sartori says.

She and her colleagues feel entitled to the same benefits enjoyed by other veterans and wartime nurses, such as the Women's Army Corps, since the Cadet Nurse Corps was part of the United States Public Health Service.

"We wore military-type uniforms and the insignia of the Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service, which Truman declared to be a branch of the military on June 21, 1945," Sartori says. "It said that anyone in the commissioned corps would get veterans' benefits." Sartori says that extending these benefits would be an official recognition long overdue. "We took care of veterans' wives and families and shipyard workers who were injured on the job," Sartori adds.

First introduced to the 105th Congress by Representative Nita M. Lowey (D-NY) in 1997, the bill never made it out of committee. Lowey and Representative James L. Oberstar (D-MN) reintroduced the bill in 1999, but again it died in committee. Although the bill never made it to the House floor a third time in 2002 during the 107th Congress, the bill has gained momentum for this year's Congress.

On January 29, the U.S. Cadet Nurse Corps Equity Act of 2003, HR 476, was introduced in the House. Finding nurses who can become politically involved has not been easy. Sartori requested attendees' names from a 50th anniversary Cadet Nurse Corps celebration in 1994 but was told the information had been lost. She finally got 700 names from the Women's Memorial in Arlington, Virginia, which documents the contributions of women during wartime. Sartori sent form letters to about 10 cadets who helped her get the word out to the hundreds of others. The grassroots campaign has steadily picked up steam in two years.

For Sartori, this is only a recent call to duty. Now that the cadets are well into their 70s and 80s, she says there's a sense of urgency about it, though for many nurses, Sartori included, the financial motive isn't primary. "I would like everyone in future generations to be aware of our contribution," Sartori says.
